Qualifications	Clear and documented evidence that at least 51% or more of the company is woman-owned, and is controlled and operated by the female(s). US citizenship or legal resident alien status. The contribution of capital and/or expertise by the woman business owner must be real and substantial and proportionate to the interest owned. The woman business owner shall have the ability to perform in the area of specialty or expertise without reliance on either the finances or resources of a firm that is not owned by a woman. WBCS also screens applicants for certification with the State of Texas as a Historically Underutilized Business (HUB). So, eligible businesses can receive both certifications through WBCS in one application process. Women Business Enterprise National Council (WBENC) is approved as a 3rd Party Certifier of SBA's Woman Owned Small Business (WOSB) Federal Contracting Program.
